General Information

- 1) All students must take 150 credit hours of a foreign language before successfully completing their programme of study. Attendance at the first class is obligatory.
- 2) Foreign language courses are incorporated in the model curriculum of studies for semesters 1-5.
- 3) International students may choose courses of Polish or of any other foreign language.
- 4) Polish students must attend a 60-hour course of English, and then a 90-hour course of another foreign language or English at a higher level.
